2012-13 Board Goals South Orange Maplewood Board of Education

- 1. Review District Goals for 2011-12 and 2012-13 and amend them to extend through the 2013-14 school year.
- 2. Complete a thorough and objective annual evaluation of the superintendent, using the format developed by the Board in March 2008 that closely aligns evaluation to achievement of District Goals.
 - a. Conduct four quarterly evaluation sessions with the superintendent in order to deliver ongoing feedback and produce the final annual evaluation.
- 3. Approve a 2013-14 budget that aligns spending with District Goals; is compliant with District Goal 4, Objective A, Indicator 1; and is responsive to taxpayer burden. Gain passage by the Board of School Estimate of a tax levy sufficient to fully support the approved 2013-14 operating budget.
- 4. Support the development of project priorities and phasing for facility improvements identified in the capital plan.
- 5. Reach negotiated agreements with both the South Orange-Maplewood Education Association (SOMEA) and the Association of Supervisors, Coordinators and Administrators (ASCA) prior to the expiration of the current agreements on June 30, 2013.
- 6. Develop in partnership with the Superintendent an annual Board agenda, including clear expectations and timing for monitoring reports to the Board that demonstrate measurable levels of progress on 2012-13 milestones.
- 7. Improve Board communications with the public.
 - a. Improve transparency of Board and committee work
 - b. Improve timeliness of Board response to public inquiries.
 - c. Implement pilot for Board office hours.
 - d. Implement pilot of Board blog.
- 8. Effectively advocate at the state level on policy and legislative issues of concern to the district, joining with other districts and the New Jersey School Boards Association to make a concerted effort to influence key decisions by the governor and the legislature.
- 9. Participate in professional development to improve best practices in school board governance.
 - Policy governance
 - Discuss factors contributing to the academic achievement gap and their relevance to SOMSD
 - Discuss how to understand diversity in perspectives and the relevance of such understanding for making progress on the achievement gap and other key issues in SOMSD.
