SOUTH ORANGE-MAPLEWOOD BOARD OF EDUCATION RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, while the "Sen. Byron M. Baer Open Public Meetings Act" (N.J.S.A. 10:4-6 et seq.) requires all meetings of the South Orange Maplewood Board of Education to be held in public, N.J.S.A. 10:4-12(b) sets forth nine (9) types of matters that may lawfully be discussed in "Executive Session," without the public being permitted to attend, and

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that some issues is permitted by N.J.S.A 10:4-12 (b) to be discussed without the public in attendance and shall be discussed during an Executive Session to be held on Thursday, November 17, 2022 at 6:30 PM, and

WHEREAS, the nine (9) exceptions to open the public meetings set forth in N.J.S.A 10:2-4(b) are listed below, and next to each exception is a box which will be marked when the issues to be privately discussed fall within that

exception, and after each exception is a space where additional information that will disclose as much information about the discussion as possible without undermining the purpose of the exception shall be written:

- \boxtimes "(1) Any matter which, by express provision of Federal law, State statute or rule of court shall be rendered confidential or excluded from public discussion." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is attorney/client privilege, HIB reporting.
- \square "(2) Any matter in which the release of information would impair a right to receive funds from the federal government." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:
- "(3) Any material the disclosure of which constitutes an unwarranted invasion of individual privacy such as any records, data, reports, recommendations, or other personal material of any educational, training, social service, medical, health, custodial, child protection, rehabilitation, legal defense, welfare, housing, relocation, insurance and similar program or institution operated by a public body pertaining to any specific individual admitted to or served by such institution or program, including but not limited to information relative to the individual's personal and family circumstances, and any material pertaining to admission, discharge, treatment, progress or condition of any individual, unless the individual concerned (or, in the case of a minor or incompetent, his guardian) shall request in writing that the same be disclosed publicly." The nature of the matters, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality are:
- "(4) Any collective bargaining agreement, or the terms and conditions of which are proposed for inclusion in any collective bargaining agreement, including the negotiation of terms and conditions with employees or representatives of employees of the public body."
- □"(5) Any matter involving the purchase, lease or acquisition of real property with public funds, the setting of banking rates or investment of public funds where it could adversely affect the public interest if discussion of such matters were disclosed." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:
- ☐ "(6) Any tactics and techniques utilized in protecting the safety and property of the public, provided that their disclosure could impair such protection. Any investigations of violations or possible violations of the law." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is: Safety and Security Update.
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\(\times\) Any matter involving the employment, appointment, termination of employment, terms and conditions of employment, evaluation of the performance, promotion or disciplining of any specific prospective public officer or employee or current public officer or employee employed or appointed by the public body, unless all individual employees or appointees whose rights could be adversely affected request in writing that such matter or matters be discussed at a public meeting." described: Employee Numbers ____.

□"(9) Any deliberation of a public body occurring after a public hearing that may result in the imposition of a specific civil penalty upon the responding party or the suspension or loss of a license or permit belonging to the responding party as a result of an act of omission for which the responding party bears responsibility." The nature of the matter, described as specifically as possible without undermining the need for confidentiality is:

WHEREAS, the length of the Executive Session is estimated to be sixty (60) minutes after which the public meeting of the Board shall reconvene and proceed with business where formal action will be taken.

• Meeting with Maplewood Middle School Student Council under the leadership of student body President, Charlie Fleisher and Student Advisor, Ms. Kleinwax. Topics ranged from gender neutral bathrooms to hydroponic farming.

- Discussion with Dr. Taylor regarding Gaggle student safety software, including the cost and effectiveness. Gaggle enables K-12 schools to monitor student activity on school-provided devices for concerning content.
- Columbia High School Student Council's Annual Volleyball Tournament was a success. Teams included students, teachers and officers from our local police departments.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE

Dr. Taylor and the Board held a moment of silence in Memory of Maplewood Police Chief Jim DeVaul.

Dr. Taylor provided an update on the following:

- Formal recognition of educators achieving tenure in SOMSD will take place annually in the fall and spring beginning with this meeting. In total 35 district educators have achieved tenure since the beginning of the 2022-23 school year. The following individuals attended tonight's meeting and were presented with a certificate: Avis Gibbons-Williams, Marc Kessler, Christine Kleinwaks, Nicholas Picillo and Nancy Sabato.
- Native American/American Indian Heritage month was acknowledged.
- Essex County Thanksgiving Emergency Food Distribution event to be held Friday, November 18, 2022. Please visit the district website for more information.
- District PTAs and HSA's are partnering with the Achieve Foundation to provide Thanksgiving meals for families in need. Please consider supporting their efforts.
- Portables/temporary classrooms were removed from Seth Boyden school during the Fall Break and will be removed from Tuscan School in the near future. Teachers and students at each school have been moved to classrooms in their building's new additions. These temporary classrooms were in place for more than a decade and were a major motivation for approval and support for our \$167 million construction project. We were able to hold our monthly Assistant Principal's meeting in Seth Boyden's new addition. We are continuing to post updates of our Long-Range Facilities Plan on the District website.
- The Class Size Report has been shared with the Board.
- The Access and Equity update will be presented next month, detailing enrollment in our high-level AP, Honors and STEM courses by demographics. An analysis has been provided to the Board detailing the initial impact of our partnership with Equal Opportunity Schools.
- We are having ongoing meetings and discussions regarding our K-5 transition plan for Marshall and Bolden Elementary Schools. We are confident we will have a firm plan of action for this important work.

NJSBA WORKSHOP

Last month, members of the Board and district administration attended the NJSBA Annual Workshop in Atlantic City. Topics included finance, governance, student achievement and boardsmanship. Special thank you to Board Member Vadlamani, who shared presentations from every seminar he attended with the board.

LRFP UPDATE

The construction bids for Marshall and Montrose will be awarded in December 2022. MMS and SOMS will be awarded in January 2023 and CHS will be awarded in February 2023. Recently finished spaces include those at Clinton, Delia Bolden, Seth Boyden and Tuscan schools. The board looks forward to touring these spaces in the near future, the Superintendent has already reached out to me to begin the planning for those tours.

SCHOOL BASED YOUTH SERVICE PLANS

Last month, we discussed the recently released plan which was set to revamp school-based youth service plans. Yesterday, the Governor announced that any changes made to provide these crucial mental health services would be made in addition to, not instead of, current school-based plans. We are happy to hear about this change of plans and look forward to hearing more from the Governor and the NJDOE on future announcements.

BOARD PRESIDENT'S STATEMENT

The school board meeting is a business meeting in public and not a meeting with the public. Oftentimes it may appear to members of our audience that the Board of Education takes action with very little comment and in many cases a unanimous vote. Before a matter is placed on the agenda at a public meeting, the Administration has thoroughly reviewed the matter with the Superintendent of Schools/Chief School Administrator (CSA). If the Superintendent of Schools/Chief School Administrator is satisfied that the matter is ready to be presented to the Board of Education, it is then referred to the appropriate Board Committee. The Members of the Board Committee work with Administration and the Superintendent to assure that the members fully understand the matter. After the committee discusses the matter, it is then shared with the other Board members for consideration. Only then is it placed on the agenda for Board discussion and action at a public meeting.
