BOARD RECOGNITION - Read by Ms. Maini

Dr. Laura Morana has been invited to serve on the New Jersey Council for Young Children, which is the state's advisory council designed to enhance the coordination and quality of early childhood systems from pregnancy through age 8.

Dr. Ramon Robles, Supervisor of World Languages/ESL, has been invited to present by the American Council on the Teaching of Foreign Languages (ACTFL). His session entitled Building a More Inclusive Environment for LGBTQ Students in World Languages will be presented at their national conference in November.

South Orange Middle School biology teacher Frank Guastella was nominated for an Emmy Award for his production of 'I Can't, I Have Rehearsal,' a documentary which examines how six New Jersey high schools staged six unique productions of 'Mary Poppins.'

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Ms. Baker declared the minutes of the Executive and Public Sessions of August 20, 2018 and the Special Executive Session of September 5, 2018 approved as presented.

SUPERINTENDENT'S UPDATE - Dr. Ficarra

Successful Completion of QSAC Monitoring

Dr. Thomas Ficarra, Interim Superintendent, announced that SOMSD successfully completed the requirements of the New Jersey Quality Single Accountability Continuum (QSAC) review conducted in April 2018. The letter from the NJDOE states that SOMSD "has satisfied at least 80% of the weighted indicators in each of the five areas of the QSAC review process and been designated as 'high performing.'" Dr. Ficarra noted that SOMSD had not passed QSAC when the district was last monitored 3 years ago, and gave kudos to the administrators, teachers, custodians and other staff who worked together to make sure the district passed in all five areas.

Opening of Schools

Dr. Ficarra updated the Board and community on the work done to prepare for the opening of schools, including cleaning work and some major facilities repairs, tons of bussing routes, scheduling for all students, and the work of the Human Resources Department to ensure we were fully staffed for the first day of school.

Chain of Command

Dr. Ficarra reminded the community of the importance of following the "chain of command" when addressing an individual issue. An extraordinary number of people email the Superintendent and/or Board of Education as a first step when trying to solve a legitimate problem. It takes longer to resolve the issue this way, when most issues can be resolved much more quickly at the school level.

BOARD PRESIDENT'S UPDATE - Ms. Baker

Elizabeth Baker, President of the Board of Education, reminded the community that the selection of a new Superintendent is one of the most important actions a Board of Education can take, and provided an update on the Superintendent Search process. The first component is community input into the goals of the search process, with deep stakeholder engagement. Dr. William Librera, the consultant working with the Board on the search, will meet with individuals and small groups, as well as with CHS students, teaching staff and administrators. There are also 3 large community meetings scheduled, and all are invited to participate in one or more of these meetings and in an online survey to share input on the priorities for leadership of the District going forward. The Board hopes to appoint a new Superintendent by Spring 2019, and will continue to keep the community informed as the search progresses.

Dr. Ficarra introduced new Administrative appointments Gayle Carrick, Interim Assistant Superintendent of Administration and Ms. Sheila Murphy, Seth Boyden Assistant Principal. Each thanked the Board and Dr. Ficarra for the opportunity and shared their enthusiasm to begin working in their new roles.

PARCC RESULTS - Dr. Morgan

Dr. Kalisha Morgan, Director of Planning and Assessment and Interim Principal of Columbia High School, reported the results from the administration of the 2018 PARCC. While the percentage of SOMSD students who met or exceeded grade level expectations is higher than the state average in both English Language Arts and Mathematics, the District still has major gaps in achievement. The District will provide an update about the initiatives underway and plans to address these gaps by the next Board of Education meeting.

Dr. Morgan also reported on the results of 2018 Advanced Placement exams. The percent of students participating in one or more AP courses increased compared to prior years, but there are still gaps in participation in both AP courses and AP exams.

PRESCHOOL EDUCATION EXPANSION AID DISCRETIONARY GRANT (PEEA) - Dr. Morana

Dr. Laura Morana, Interim Executive Director of Special Services, announced that SOMSD has been awarded a \$1.4 million competitive grant from the NJDOE to expand our preschool services. This first year of the grant, the additional funding will be used to:

- Extend the school day;
- Add a Master Teacher and a Social Worker/Family Liaison to SOMSD staff;
- Make the preschool program free for all enrolled students;
- Provide high-quality preschool services to 30 additional children in South Orange and Maplewood by working with partner organizations; and
- Enhance the Pre-School Intervention Referral Team system.

While the \$1.4 million grant is for 2018-2019, SOMSD will have the opportunity to renew our application annually and continue to enhance and expand our preschool program. We project that annual PEEA funding will allow the district to provide a full-day, high-quality program for 400 students, free-of charge, by the 2022-2023 school year.

The committee discussed the Long Range Facilities Plan and resolving issues with the Powerschool Application.

Labor, Relations & Personnel - Ms. Pai

The committee received data regarding summer hires and as a result has requested a full report to evaluate employee demographics to align staff to be more reflective of the student population. The committee also discussed staff recruitment, retention of staff and job descriptions for all key administrative positions to outline roles and responsibilities.
