Dear Annemarie, Shannon, Erin, Elizabeth, Robin, Thair, Tony, Johanna, and Kamal,

I'm writing about the task facing you tomorrow (Saturday) to write up the one-year evaluation of Dr. Taylor as Superintendent.

One third of you are members of the SOMa Families for Effective Teaching Facebook group, and so are familiar with the concerns of many of the more than 800 members—parents, students, teachers and other community members—who use the platform to share their experiences and to discuss how well their kids are learning in the district. To the six of you who haven't yet joined, I invite and encourage you to do so, as it will give you a lot of insight into the daily experiences of your constituents' lives and will help you best serve the SOMSD community. It also gives you the opportunity to contribute to the discussion as you feel appropriate and to educate us all on your activities and views. We have former BOE members as well who are extremely valuable contributors.

Our members hold a range of views on what's happening in the district, but I think these are the most pressing issues to focus on now:

SOMSD has been facing great challenges in regard to curriculum and instruction that long pre-date Dr. Taylor's tenure. On the one hand nobody expects him—or you—to fix them all immediately. On the other hand, families are anxious to see steady visible improvements, to receive a clear, strong impression that the district is headed in the right direction, and to get a sense of some of the possible concrete solutions that are under consideration. My personal view is that these things have been lacking.

The pandemic has added major obstacles to effective teaching through distance learning. On the one hand, families are eager to grant a lot of slack to everybody involved in coping with those challenges. On the other hand we have many members who either teach in or who have kids or friends in other nearby districts, and most of those who have shared those perspectives have been disappointed in our district's comparative ability to adapt. We *must* do much better.

As a 20-year resident of South Orange and a parent of two SOMSD kids for eleven years, as well as someone who has been trying to contribute a llittle to improving one aspect of education in our district—teaching effectiveness—I only ask of you one thing:

Please take seriously your responsibility to hold Dr. Taylor accountable for his performance in a frank and fair manner. As I posted on our group today, everyone who has met Dr. Taylor has liked him and everyone I've spoken with wants him to succeed. But success in any endeavor demands high expectations and rigorous accountability—particularly when it comes to leadership. Accountability in this context means: credit where credit is due, censure for preventable failures, a point-by-point check on the requirements and expectations listed for the job, and guidance and clear expectations for

future performance. There are so many areas for which the Superintendent is responsible. But if kids are not learning adequately and across the board, the other isses pale in significance.

SOMa is a community of friendly, empathetic people. We also have a culture of high expectations, deeply held values and strong opinions. I hope that these qualities can all be employed when you sit down tomorrow to discuss how your evaluation will be framed. With strong leadership and firm support we can surely succeed in turning the district around.
